Autumn 2019

This half term we will be learning about:

- In our first term in Year 2, we will be learning all about transport from the past and the inventor George Stephenson. We will be designing and making our own 'Wheeled Vehicles in Art & DT. We will be finding out about Everyday Materials and Caring For Our Environment in Science and Weather in our Geography lessons. We have some fantastic visits planned to Beamish Museum, BBC Studios and The Hindu Temple.
- We will also be having phonics, Basic Skills, English and Maths sessions on a daily basis and focussing on Traditional Tales & Key Stories in English. In maths we will focus on Number, Place Value, Addition & subtraction.

Our targets

To achieve success this term the children will aspire to meet the following targets:

In Writing

- To correctly form our letters
- To write in different ways, e.g. a story, a piece of non-fiction writing, a poem, a letter and other genres of writing
- To use our knowledge of sounds to write difficult words
- To write in sentences, using basic punctuation

In Reading

- To read sentences on our own
- Retell stories in the correct order, using story language
- Use non-fiction texts to find answers to questions

In Mathematics

- To use maths ideas to solve problems
- Use vocabulary related to addition and subtraction
- To mentally recall number bonds to 10 and 20
- To recognise, count and order numbers to 100 and beyond
- To use language such as greater, smaller, heavier, lighter, to compare qualities
- To use mathematical language to describe 2D and 3D shapes.
