Opportunities to read in Year One continue to be :

- Your child's school reader
- Class library book

We expect children to read **daily** with an adult at home.

Please make sure that reading at home is recorded in the yellow reading diary – we can not change their book unless it is !
School reading book and diary should be returned to school EVERY day for our morning reading session.

Remember

- **PE kits** – PE kits should be in school EVERY DAY. They can be taken home at the end of half term for washing.
Children do need outdoor kit – Black / Navy hoodie and track pants and OUTDOOR PE SHOES.
- No ear rings/ jewellery or nail varnish to be worn at school please.
- Children must be collected at 3.15 by a named adult. Please ensure these details are updated via the school office.
