<u>Mathematics</u>

This term we will begin by focussing on written multiplication and division. We will also continue to develop mental and written strategies of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. Other areas we are learning about this term include: fractions, decimals and percentages. This will include adding and subtracting fractions, comparing them, converting mixed numbers to improper fractions and vice versa, rounding, ordering and comparing decimals, and looking at equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages.

As usual we will be practising arithmetic skills and the children will be using rapid recall boards to practise the skills expected from them in Year 5.

Please continue to practise times tables as this has such a positive impact on learning in maths.

Homework will be given weekly and is due in on Mondays.

<u>Science</u>

In the first half of the term we will be studying the Earth and space, learning about the planets and how they move around the solar system. The second half of the term will involve planning, carrying out and writing up experiments and investigations! As part of our Science topics, we will be visiting the Centre for Life in Newcastle where we will take part in a workshop as well as having the opportunity to look around the exhibits.

Topic


Our Geography topic for the first half term is mapping. We will be using maps and atlases to locate different places. We will look at the imaginary lines on the Earth; the equator, tropics, longitude and latitude as well as the hemispheres and poles. We will also recap continents and countries of the world. In Spring 2 we will move to History—studying the Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. This will link to our English text of Beowulf which is full of action.
